Typical symptoms of stress in passengers and crew.

After the session the candidate will be able to understand about the importance of giving clear and precise instructions.

Strategies to be followed for overcoming the language barrier.

Lecturer to go through Power Point, on the concerns about the passengers and the crew concern about the emergency situation
